This project involves working with two leading NSW remote Aboriginal community organisations to develop and pilot an innovative child injury prevention program, with a focus on health literacy.

Why study with us?

You will be enrolled through the School of Public Health and Community Medicine at UNSW Sydney and supervised by the Head of School, Professor Rebecca Ivers. The School of Public Health and Community Medicine has a strong team of researchers committed to working in partnership with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to improve the health and wellbeing of children and young people. It is a vibrant and supportive place to study and conduct high quality, culturally safe research. You will be provided with a local community induction and oversight from the Aboriginal community organisations.

You will have the opportunity to engage in world-class research under the guidance of highly-respected researchers and supervisors on a project with strong Aboriginal leadership. This Aboriginal identified scholarship is funded by the Centre of Research Excellence in Aboriginal Child and Adolescent health (<https://www.crereach.org.au>) and comprehensive training and mentoring opportunities will be provided.

Who are we looking for?

You will be an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person eligible to enroll in a PhD or Master's by research and will have a background in health science (medicine, allied health, psychology, public health or similar). Domestic students only. Candidates from arts or law disciplines will also be considered.
